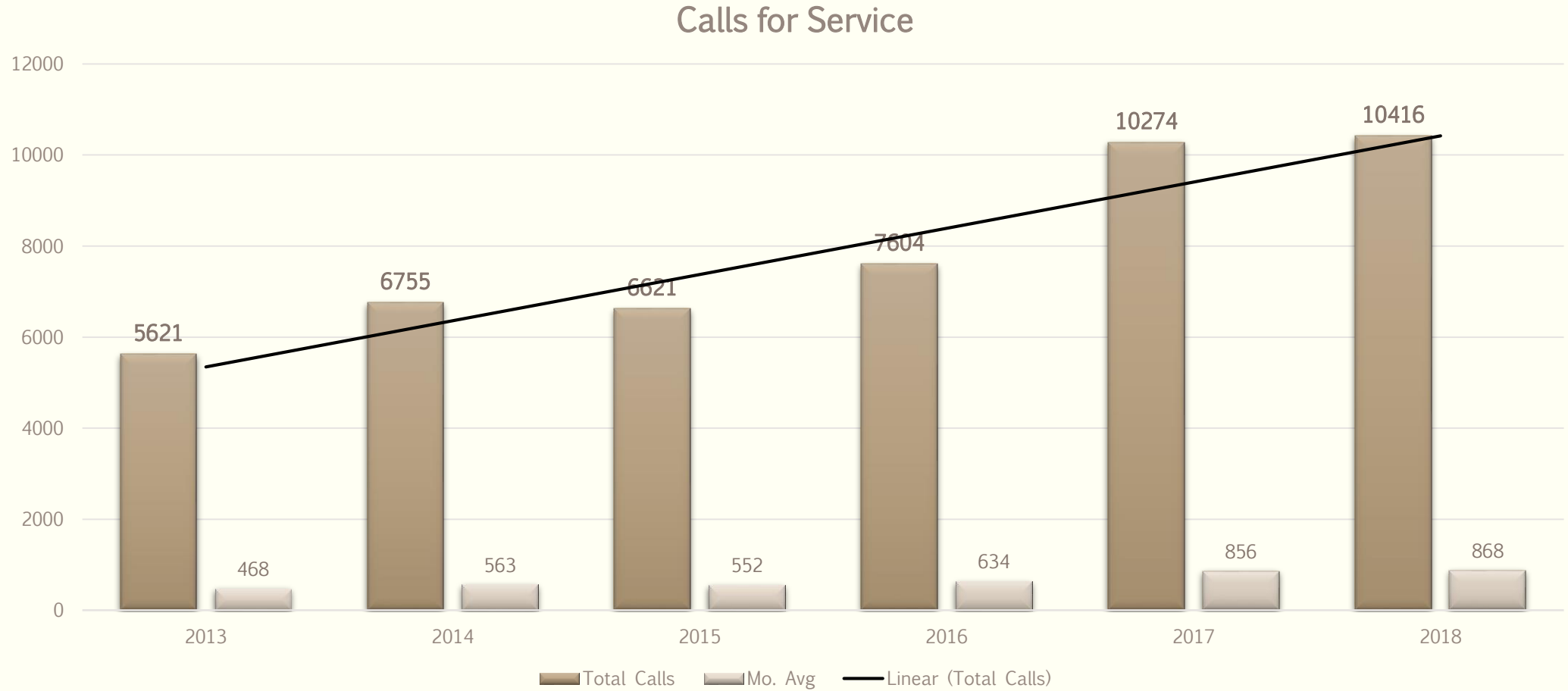

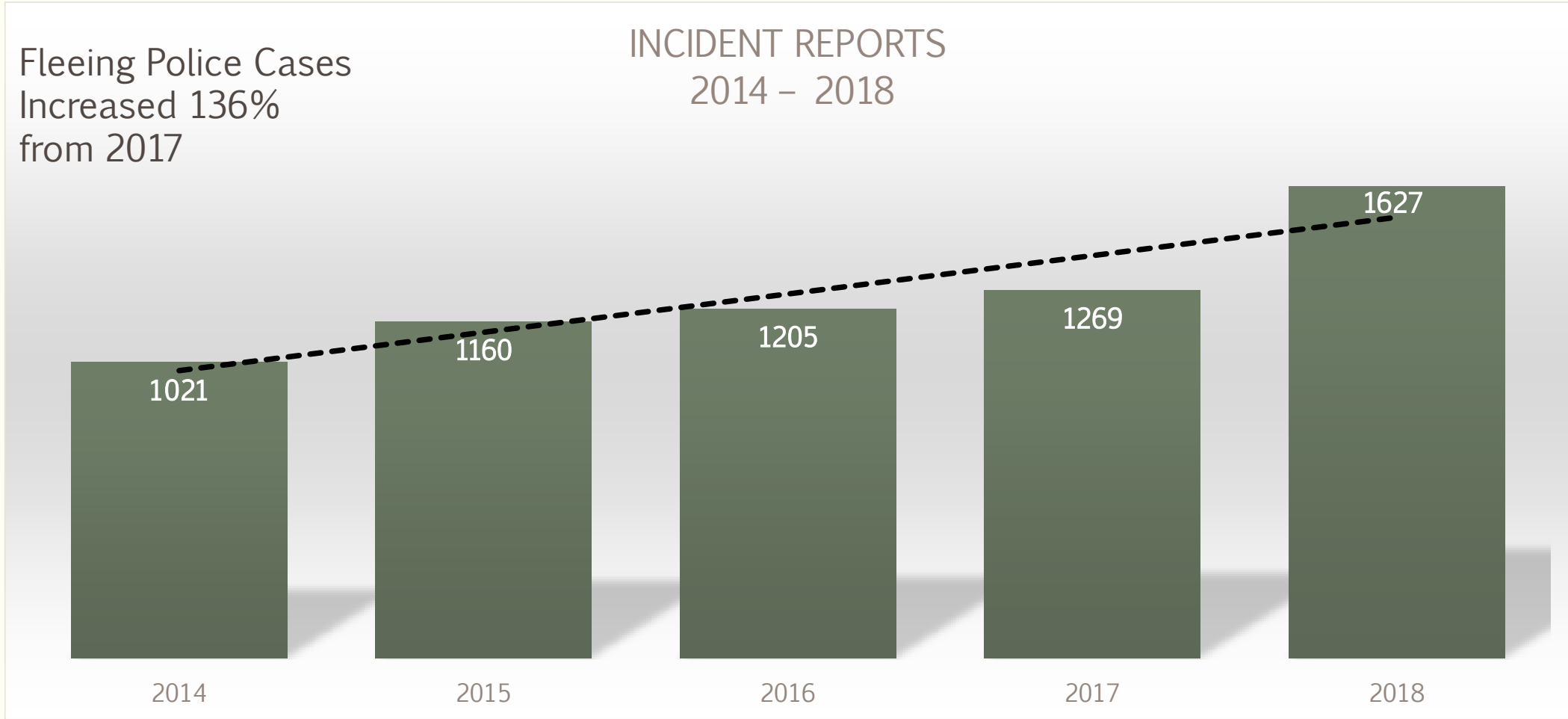
2018 Strategic Management Theme

District 1 – South of K-32

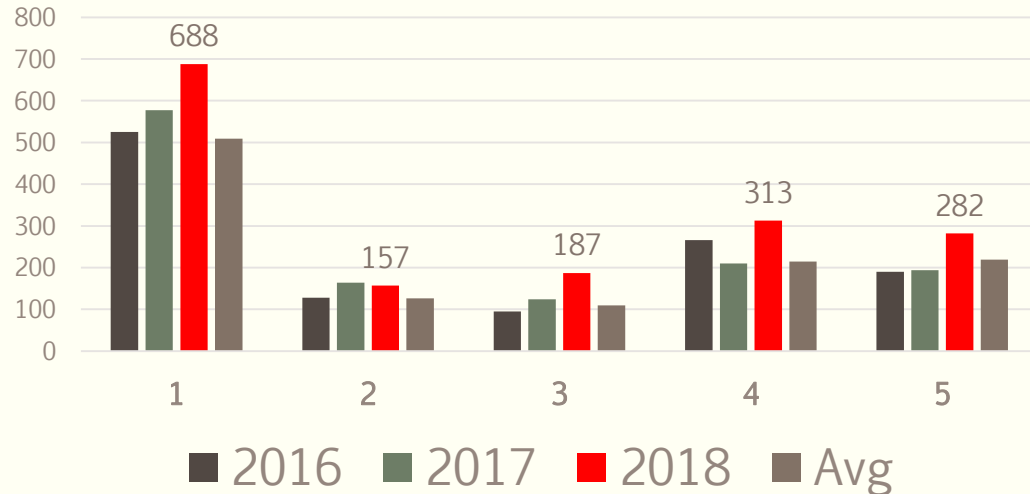
District 2 – North of K-32, West of 102 St.

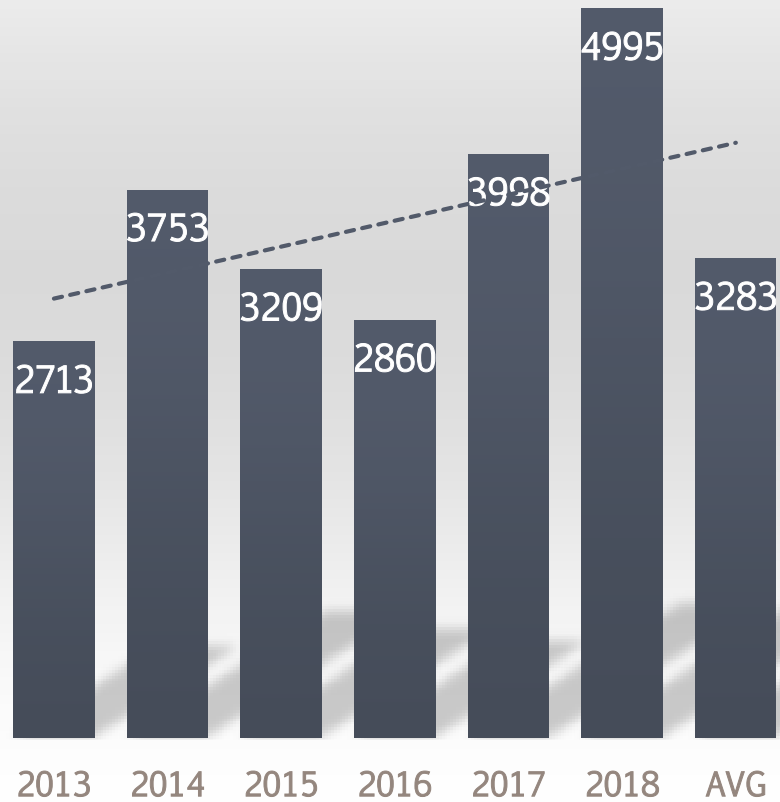

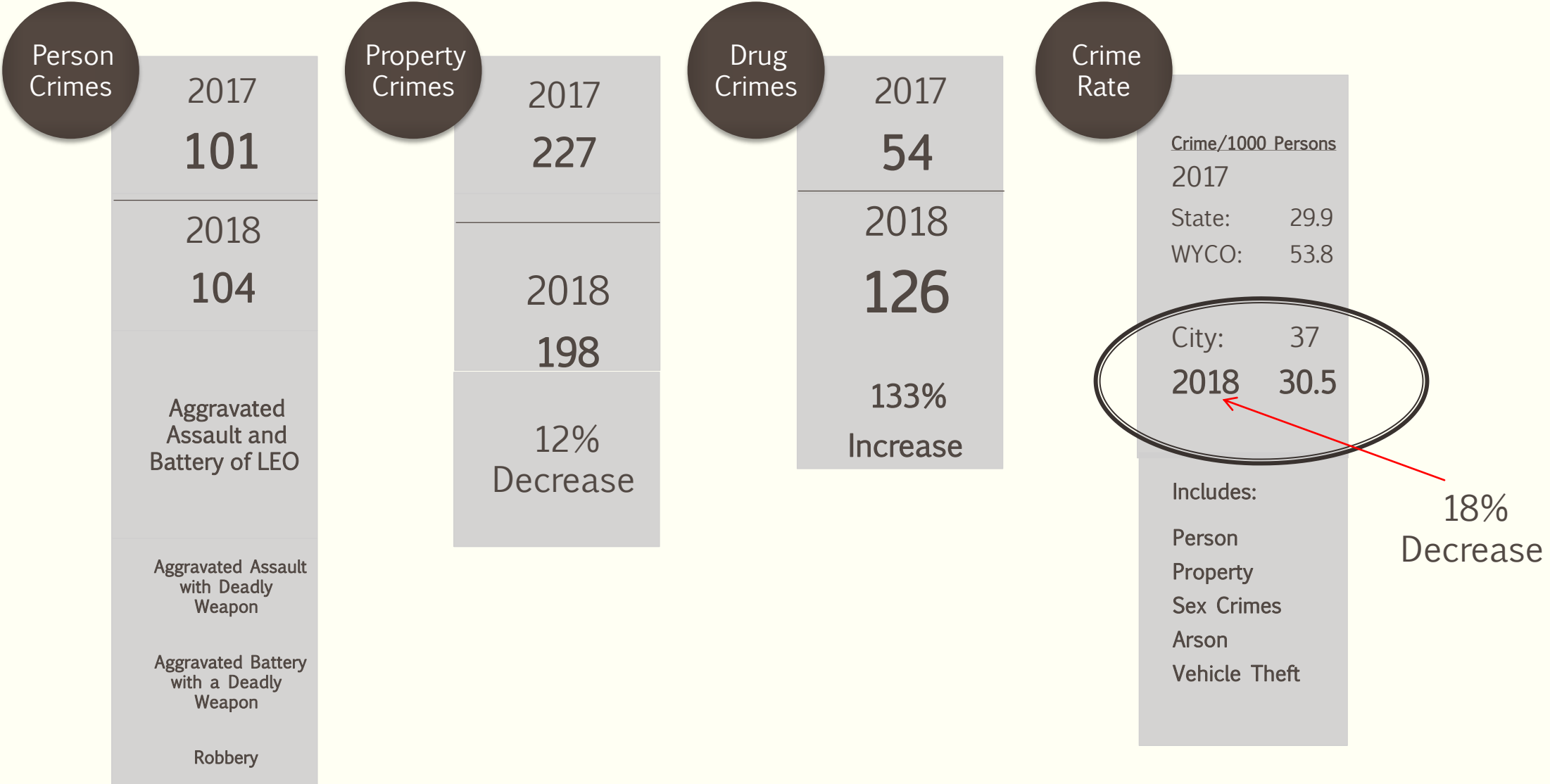
